# 3. Lucton Burial Ground railings



A Lucton resident approached the Parish Council regarding removal of the railings which are alongside a fence that has recently been erected. The PCC consider the railings to be part of the heritage of the Burial Ground where the ongoing maintenance is financially supported by the Parish Council. Refurbishment would only be possible with Parish Council financial support. Neither can they be removed without the Diocesan approval by way of a faculty.

# **Update**

#### 1. Treasurer Report:

Donations received from music in churchyard, the wall box, use of Marquee and bric a brac stall. Still only paying in funds once a month. Still awaiting final retention bill for Croft work

# 2. Church Warden Report:

St. Leonards: Need replacement lightbulbs.

#### Croft:

Met with Anna from National Trust, they are planning to do Christmas Light spectacular again, shining lights onto the Church. It was suggested that we arrange one or two Carol services with maybe choir from Leominster Priory who could bring an organist. Also Lucton school may have a choir who could also perform on a different evening

Major problem at Croft with the floor. Jane has met with Andrew Pike, an archaeologist rom DAC to look at the tiles. We could lift and display the nicer ones or we get a covering to go over them that preserves them. DAC going to arrange a site visit and then make suggestions.

The NT also suggested getting the clock working again, awaiting estimates, likely to need major grant funding

Survey of the Croft graveyard being done to determine where ancient burials would be but historic graveyards should be part of the Church. We would need them to build up the path outside the church entrance where flooding has been occurring since the metal edging was installed/

Croft also needs redecorating.

# 3. St. Leonards Management update

- a. Feedback from Gordon identifies
  - i. Request for music in church outside of services this would require sound system upgrade – opposed by Oliver who believes the Church should be quiet
  - ii. Church specific wheelie bin to be investigated although PCC unclear what rubbish gets put in that bin.
